Our Curriculum

- *Our Curriculum*
- Considers the whole child with the child's wellbeing being the foundation of the curriculum;
- Acknowledges the interrelated nature of development and learning. Provides opportunities for our preschool community to develop and extend on their understanding and skills in key learning areas such as :
- language and literacy, science technology, engineering, arts and mathematics [STEAM]; and social, physical, emotional and spiritual development.
- Supports a reflexive programme that is based on a collaborative response to observations and documentations of children's strengths, abilities and interests aligning with the EYLF;
- Scaffolds child's learning through collaboration and communication with other children and adults, and through interacting with the environment;
- Advocates for child safe environments through weaving the NSW Child Safe Standards and the elements in the NQF through the curriculum;
- Fosters and develops a social conscience among children with a view addressing social inequities;
- Respects that the needs of children, families, staff and the community are constantly changing and that we must be responsive to those needs in the delivery of our services;
- Honours and respects Indigenous Australian culture, voices and their knowledge in taking care of our natural environment;
- Welcomes children, families, staff and celebrates the diversity of cultures in our community;
- Provides a balance between a secure home-like space and a stimulating environment that encourages children to explore, solve problems, create and construct;
- Provides opportunities for an appreciation and respect for the natural environment, promoting children's understanding about their responsibility to the environment;
- Challenges children to explore their physical abilities through opportunities to extend and develop skills; and
- Strives to be a centre of inclusiveness for early childhood within our community.
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
